**Three Arrested after Altercation in Marinwood**

San Rafael, CA- On May 20, 2009 at about 4:30 AM, the Marin County Sheriff's Office Communications Center received a 9-1-1 call from a Marinwood resident reporting an argument in the street. Sheriff's deputies responded to the area of Blackstone and Las Gallinas and observed two vehicles leaving the area. As deputies approached one of the vehicles at the top of Las Gallinas, the front passenger fled the vehicle on foot into the Open Space. Deputies detained the three remaining subjects.

Deputies also located another vehicle nearby, with one of the occupants suffering from facial lacerations apparently received from a stabbing instrument. The victim stated he had been cut and kicked in the face. The victim refused medical treatment at the scene. The driver of the vehicle also believed she heard a TASER-type noise during the altercation.

The victim and one of the other occupants of the victim's vehicle positively identified the three subjects who had been detained as the persons involved in assaulting the victim.

The three subjects were arrested on charges of assault with a deadly weapon and conspiracy. Booked into the Marin County Jail were:

1. Emilio Romayor, an 18 year old male from San Jose, CA,
2. Rogelio Romayor, a 21 year old male from San Jose, CA, and
3. Alexander Landis, an 18 year old male from San Jose, CA.

A pocket knife was located in the possession of Emilio Romayor and a box cutter was located on Rogelio Romayor. In addition, an electronic control device was located during an inventory search of the suspects' vehicle.

With the assistance of a police canine from the Novato Police Department, as well as officers from the San Rafael Police Department, the area was searched for the outstanding suspect, but he was not located.
