**Unfounded** - When the investigation discloses that the alleged acts did not occur or did not involve department members. Complaints that are determined to be frivolous will fall within the classification of unfounded (Penal Code § 832.8). A frivolous complaint is one that is totally and completely without merit and for the sole purpose of harassing department personnel (Code of Civil Procedures § 128.6(b) PECIAL INVESTIGATIONS

**Exonerated** - When the investigation discloses that the alleged act occurred, but that the act was justified, lawful, and/or proper.
